- 1. 301st Bombardment Group (H), AAF.

- 3. 23 B-17's dropped 69 tons of 500 lb. GP., .1 nose and .025 tail fusing, at 1303A hrs. from a mean altitude of 16,560 ft.
- 4. No a/c returned early.
- 5. No e/a encountered.
- 6. No claims.
- 7. No a/c losses.
- 8. Slight heavy flak encountered over target, inaccurate as to altitude and deflection.
- 9. Photos reveal extremely heavy concentration of bombs throughout the southern half of the R.R. Yds. M.N.O/6,7,8 on T.C. 4-113-NA. Also many hits scored on tracks in north half of R.R. Yds. Many direct hits scored on south approach to bridge at J/9 and some near misses on the bridge.
