SPECIAL NARRATIVE REPORT:

MISSION: 14 October 1944 Blechhammer (N), Germany.

I. ENEMY RESISTANCE

- A. Fighters: Negative.
- B. Flak: Flak was encountered at the target, it being of the barrage type, both moderate and inaccurate.

II. SIGNIFICANT OBSERVATIONS

- A. Communications: Estimated 200 cars in U/Y's at 48/52 N, 18/03 E. 100 cars at 47/05 N, 17/55 E. New large bridge seen at 47/48 N, 17/40E.
- B. Flak Positions: 12 Gun battery reported at 47/43 N, 18/01 E. Flak encountered at Veszprem.
- C. Smoke Screens: Very ineffective smoke screen observed in target area.
- D. Naval: 29-30 barges seen in Danube near Győr.
- E. Airdromes: 10-15 S/E & T/E planes on Papa A/D, 42/20 N, 17 deg 30'E.
