- 1. In compliance with basic communication the following information is submitted in regards to S/Sgt HUDSON, THOMAS J., 18165858, Killed in Action 25 May 1944:
  - a. Statement of 2nd Lt Kevin (nmi) Shepherd, pilot of B-17 aircraft #0443, as given 29 May 1944: "Flying high right position of the second wave in AC #0443 the formation went into a cloud. I pulled out to the right and gained altitude. I came out on the side of the cloud. Just then I saw the nose section of the CD plane flaming and falling straight down. Didn't see the tail section. It seemed to be broken off from bombay back. Flying at 7,500 feet I circled to the right, saw a plane hit the top of a 3,500 foot mountain. Saw three different fires which seemed to be from one aircraft."
